3. Venue

The event center will be set in the Rusutsu Resort Hotel in Rusutsu, Hokkaido. Rusutsu is in the southwest of Hokkaido in northern Japan. For further information about Rusutsu, visit <https://rusutsu.com/en/>.

All competitions and activities will be held in Rusutsu resort, and the event center will also be there. The resort also provides some rank of accommodations. It takes 2 hours from New Chitose

International Airport by bus. There are some direct flight connections from Tokyo, Nagoya and Osaka International Airport to New Chitose Airport.

The event office will be open from February 28 to March 6, 2026.

5. Climate and Altitude

In early March, Rusutsu, Japan, experiences cold temperatures with average highs around 5°C and lows near -10°C. However, temperatures can rise sharply when the sun is out. During this period, the average depth of snow is 100-180cm.

The village of Rusutsu is situated at an elevation of approximately 400 meters above sea level, and the competition will be held at altitudes between 400m and 600m.

6. Maps

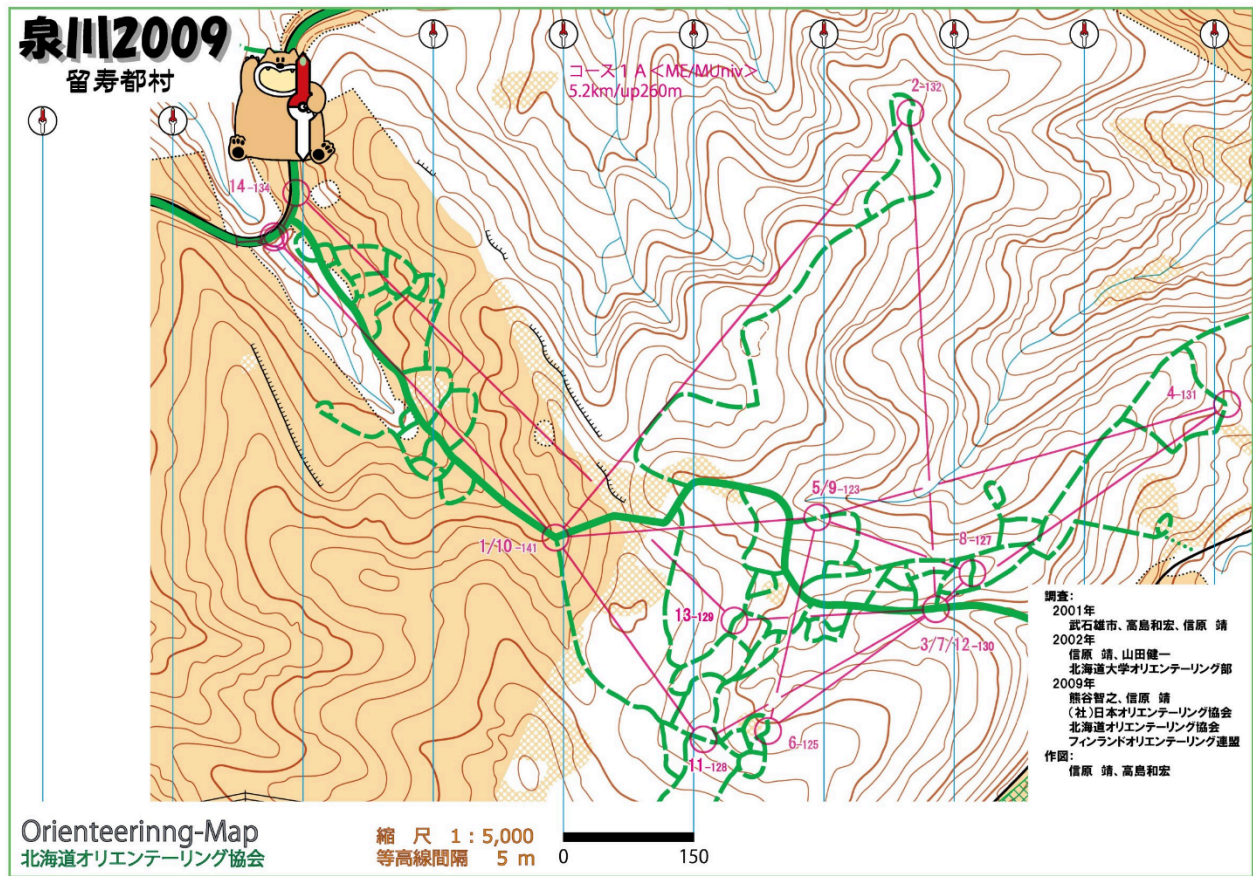
The latest Ski-Orienteering maps of the planned area will be posted and updated on the eventor.

This terrain is located at the hilly area of Rusutsu Village, roughly midway within Shikotsu-Tōya National Park.

The competition area comprises relatively flat wasteland and wetland areas along rivers, steep forested mountain areas, and a golf course on the hills.

It also includes some pastureland and fields.

Annual snowfall typically reaches 2 to 3 meters. While many streams are covered in snow, numerous sections cannot be crossed, necessitating considerable caution when considering shortcuts.

8. Participation

8.1. General

- All competitors represent a National Federation.
- A competitor may represent only one National Federation during any one 12-month period running from November to October.
- All competitors must be citizens of the country of the National Federation they are representing. They must be able to provide either a passport or other valid documentation proving their citizenship.
- Each participating National Federation must appoint a team manager / team managers to act as contact person(s) between the team and the organizer. It is the team manager's duty to see that the team receives all necessary information.
- Competitors participate at their own risk. Insurance against accidents is the responsibility of their Federation or themselves.

8.2 WSOC

- Each National Federation may enter a team with an unlimited number of competitors and an unlimited number of team officials.
- In each individual competition, every Federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men. In addition, each Federation may enter up to a further 2 women and 2 men who qualify for the Women U23 and Men U23 classes respectively.
- In the Sprint Relay, each Federation may enter two teams consisting of 2 team members of whom at least one must be a woman. Teams with competitors from more than one Federation are not allowed and incomplete teams must not start. Under no circumstances may persons other than entered competitors participate in the competition.
- All competitors must have a valid IOF Athlete License. Please ensure that the Athlete License fees are paid before the competitions.

12. Punching System

The Emit Touch Free Punching system will be used.

All competitors will be provided with two tags by the organizer for the duration of the event (primary and secondary card). Only these may be used in the competitions.

The Team Officials Meetings will be held in the North Wing Area Seminar Hall .There will be no online broadcast, but all material presented in the Team Officials' Meetings will be available on the IOF Eventor and on the event website the same evening.

17. Competition Area and Finish Area

- The finish area for all events will be near the Westin Hotel.
- The Westin Hotel will be the venue for the sprint relay. Please follow the designated route to the Westin Tower. The start is approximately a 5-minute walk from the Westin Tower.
- Sprint, pursuit, and middle distance events will be transported by bus to a quarantine area near the start.
- Bus boarding times will be determined based on the start time, but the ride from Rusutsu Resort is approximately 10-20 minutes for each event.
- After disembarking from the bus, waiting areas for athletes will include some restaurants or tents near the competition area. Restrooms are available.
- Luggage can be left in the waiting area. After all races have finished, luggage will be transported to the gymnasium at Rusutsu Resort.
- Participants will not be permitted to return to Rusutsu Resort after traveling by bus until all athletes have started.. Furthermore, the use of communication devices, such as cell phones, is prohibited within the quarantine area.
- Driving private vehicles to the waiting area is not permitted.

18. Quarantine

In the individual races there will be a start quarantine for WSOC participants. The exact locations and times for the start quarantine will be published in Bulletin 4. It is strictly forbidden to communicate with persons outside the quarantine. Therefore it is also not allowed to have any electronic communication device in the quarantine. This includes e.g. mobile phones, smart watches and laptops.

19. Embargoed Area

Please note that staying at the Westin Hotel, the alpine skiing course, and the commercial facilities on the accommodation side of the Westin Hotel are included in the restricted area.

The Westin Hotel 's atrium building itself is accessible during the competition periods, but DO NOT go to the Westin Hotel area before the competition period, and DO NOT go inside the Westin Hotel 's tower (accommodation area) even during the competition period.

Areas used for pre-competition events are not accessible afterward.

There is an alpine ski resort in front of the hotel, but going up the hill with cross-country skiing is prohibited.

Half board meal and during the competition and the fee for the banquet is included.

Lunch can be purchased at Rusutsu Resort or at a convenience store within walking distance.

There are two types of lodges available: one for 16 people and one for 24 people.

Wax table includes one waxing table, a 100V power supply, and a designated waxing space located in the Arena at Rusutsu Resort Hotel. This waxing area is not a private room. Rusutsu Resort Hotel has waxing rooms available free of charge for general guests. However, as these rooms are designed for alpine skiing, they may be inconvenient for Nordic skiing.

The organizer plans to provide one shared wax table available for free use. However, it is expected to be difficult for a large number of people to use it. Therefore, the organizers strongly recommend that each country use the paid "Wax table."

22. Travel Information

If you're planning a trip to Rusutsu Resort from overseas, the journey typically begins with a flight into Japan's northern island of Hokkaido, most conveniently via New Chitose Airport (CTS) near Sapporo. Thanks to its status as a major international hub, New Chitose receives flights from numerous Asian cities and often connects seamlessly with other global destinations through Tokyo's Narita or Haneda airports. For travelers coming from North America or Europe, it's common to book a multi-leg itinerary—either via a major Japanese gateway or another Asian city like Seoul or Hong Kong—before arriving in Sapporo.

Once you've touched down at New Chitose, the next stage is a roughly 120-minutes transfer to Rusutsu Resort. Although car rental is an option, for most visitors the easiest and most comfortable method is a door-to-door coach service that runs directly between the airport and the resort.

If you prefer more flexibility, consider renting a car. Hokkaido's well-maintained roads and scenic landscapes make for a pleasant drive, but remember that winters can be snowy and challenging for those unaccustomed to such conditions. Another option is to catch a train from New Chitose to Sapporo Station, then transfer to a bus bound for Rusutsu. While this route takes a bit more effort, it can be an appealing choice if you'd like to explore Sapporo's city center—its eclectic dining scene, smart city innovations, and high-speed internet infrastructure—before heading into the tranquil, snow-kissed world of Rusutsu.

If there is no bus available at your preferred time, please contact us. We will negotiate with the bus company to arrange additional services.

23. Waxing Facilities

- A dedicated waxing space will be provided for countries that have applied in advance.
- A waxing table (with space for two vises) will be set up within the waxing space.
- Please bring your own 100V iron or a transformer.
- If you need to rent an iron, we will lend irons with a maximum temperature of approximately 170°C in a 100V environment. Please contact us if you have any special requests.
- Waxing space is available 24 hours a day, and the wax space (wax table) will be available from 9 AM on February 23rd to 5 PM on March 7th.
- A ski testing area will be set up near the hotel.
- If teams bring additional wax tables of their own to place in the pre-registered wax space area, there is no restriction on placing additional items inside the space, but it may be a bit cramped, so if you need an additional table, we recommend reserving two spaces.

24. Regional Information

There are two 24-hour convenience stores directly in front of Rusutsu Resort. You can purchase daily necessities, groceries, fruit, and more. Within Rusutsu Resort, there are also many restaurants, bakeries, and stores selling daily necessities and alpine skiing gear. However, these stores do not sell cross-country skiing equipment or wax.

25. Ban of Fluorinated Waxes

The use of fluorinated waxes is forbidden.

Details of the implementation during the competitions in Rusutsu will be given in a later bulletin.

The use of fluorinated waxes is forbidden. If used previously, all equipment (skis, waxing irons, scrapers, brushes, ski bags, ...) must be thoroughly cleaned of fluorinated substances. . It is not allowed to bring fluorinated waxes to the event.

Spot checks and testing of equipment for fluorinated compounds may take place.

All competitors are required to fill out, sign and hand in to the event office a declaration of conformity. A Team Official representing a national team may make the declaration on behalf of the entire team. A signed declaration is mandatory for participation in the event.

26. Anti-Doping

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organisers of the WSOC are committed to supporting the Anti-Doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out at any time during the competitions, in accordance with the procedures set out in the WADA International Standard of Testing and Investigations. The latest IOF Anti-Doping Rules and the World Anti-Doping Code apply. Athletes who are selected for doping control must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping control station. They should also present their personal Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, athletes are advised to take their ID to all competitions and events. A photocopy of passport is acceptable as an official identification.

28. Opportunities for training

28.1. About the Training courses

There are several cross country skiing courses near Rusutsu resort.

(Kuyan: 2×2km course, Kyogoku: 2km course, Kimobetsu: 3km course)

Bus transportation will be prepared by request from 1 week (Feb/23 Mon) before the competition. (Bus will depart on around 9:00 and 13:30 every day by request, only for who stays at Rusutsu resort.) It takes about 10-20 minutes to the training area. The destination will vary depending on the day.

There are cross country ski courses only, no snowmobile track but map will be prepared. For this service, you need to pay 10,000 yen for whole period or 3,000 yen/per day. We can offer the same price for accommodation at Rusutsu-resort for the training camp.

If you would like to go to training on March 4th (rest day), please let the Event Center know by 5:00 PM on March 2nd. We are also planning to arrange buses to Sapporo (10,000 yen round trip) for sight seeing.

28.2. About Model Event

Model Event will be held at a location approximately 10 minutes by bus from Rusutsu Resort.
